## PROGRAMME OVERVIEW:

Gain worthwhile experience working in a fast-pace, professional environment with a suburban newspaper in Perth, Western Australia.

### The Journalism Programme

Perth's suburban newspapers are independent of any national or multinational media organisations; their editorial content is not influenced by any vested interests. The newspapers are owned and operated by West Australians who live and work in their circulation areas. They have their fingers on the pulse of local issues as they happen. They pride themselves on this independent approach rather than promoting a generic "look" based on style rather than content.

The newspaper covers a broad range of subjects from business, sport, news, and local stories plus most other content that you would typically find in community newspapers. It is unlikely that you will focus on one specific area, but in many areas of the paper.

Newspapers are normally out on Friday, which means the work has to be submitted before Thursday. Friday often includes team group meetings when they discuss what will be in next issue.

### Work Content

You will be working at a community newspaper based in Fremantle, which about 30 minutes from Perth's CBD. You will be involved in a variety of roles at the newspaper and your work will be very varied.

The newspaper is a privately owned and operated suburban newspaper in the Perth metropolitan area. The papers are free weeklies delivered to all homes and businesses in their respective areas. The newspaper has a higher amount of household letter box deliveries than the opposition in the same area.

As a volunteer you will undertake a number of tasks and generally be asked to help out in a wide number of areas thus giving your placement variety and hopefully you can learn a great deal from the placement. Depending on your ability as a journalist and a worker you will be assigned various tasks and jobs to undertake.

Here is a breakdown of the job roles you can typically expect to be involved in:

- Planning
- Investigating
- Preparing
- Writing

Plus everything you would expect from a journalistic point of view and from a medium size newspaper. For example, at times you may be expected to take pictures (depending on your skill level) or plan your own arrangements to do a story (including arranging your own transport to get to the story).

This project is a great opportunity for people who are serious about journalism and will give you the opportunity to gain real working experience.

The staff at the newspaper are very friendly and liberal - they are keen to help mould you into a journalist.

### Requirements

- You MUST have experience and/or a degree in Journalism.
- You will be required to use your initiative and to "think on your feet".
- You must be driven and able to work autonomously.
- You will be required to meet serious deadlines!

### Working Hours

You will be asked to work 5 days a week, from Monday to Friday.

## LOCATION:

**Western Australia is home to some of the best and largest surfing waves in the world, white sandy beaches and a virtually untouched coral reef stretching for 260km!**

Our programs are based in Perth, the gateway and capital city of Western Australia (WA). Of the almost two million people that live in Western Australia, the vast majority reside in the state's capital. Perth was settled on the banks of the Swan River in the 1800s and leaves a lasting impression on all of its visitors.

Perth's brilliant blue skies and warm sunny climate must be experienced to be believed. Perth is said to have the most days of sunshine of any capital city in Australia. There is always plenty to do in this sophisticated and scenic city – enjoy water sports on the Swan River, sample local wine or explore the 400 hectares of natural bush land in central Kings Park.

Perth is also the home of the world's oldest operating mint (where gold and silver production can be seen), numerous museums and art galleries, historic buildings full of character, a five-star resort and casino and a great variety of shopping - all of which are only minutes from the Central Business District. Perth boasts over 80 kilometres of white sandy beaches to sunbathe on – the most popular being Cottesloe and Scarborough, both within easy reach of the city.

Northbridge is Perth's cultural and entertainment area, just a few minute's walk north of Perth City the other side of the train station. Northbridge is home to a number of pubs, nightclubs, bars, cafes, shops, galleries and oh so many restaurants!



## ACCOMMODATION & FOOD:

You'll be accommodated in a centrally located lodge that is friendly and relaxing, making it ideal for long term stays. Your accommodation is located in the CBD (Central Business District) of Perth, Western Australia. Therefore you are very central, close to the main train station and shopping district. You'll have your own room, but will share a bathroom with others on your floor.

There is an excellent kitchen and storage area for cooking meals and plenty of space to relax. Entertainment at your accommodation includes a pool table, cheap internet access, arcade machines and cable TV (Foxtel), to name a few. But with all the sunshine Perth has – you'll be out and about enjoying the many outdoor activities! You are literally a stroll from the Swan River and free CBD transport.

At weekends you will find markets, entertainment and plenty of alfresco style cafes to laze in. Perth has restaurants to suit all tastes - the most popular cuisine is of course the great Australian BBQ. Barbeque facilities are abundant in local parks - take your own food and cook up a feast, Australian style!

## GETTING TO YOUR PROJECT

Transport budget is not included in your placement. You'll travel to your project using public transport. On your first day, you'll usually be accompanied by a Travellers team member who will show you how to use public transport to get to your placement. If you have any questions regarding the transport routes please ask your organiser who will be happy to help you.



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**VISAS:**

Visas are required for Australia, but don't worry we will liaise with you about specific visa requirements, and make the visa process very easy.

**FLIGHTS:**

You have the option to arrange your own flights or we can assist you with your flight arrangements. If you would like us to do this for you, we will liaise with you regarding available flights and dates to suit you. When you arrive, you will be welcomed at the airport by our Australian Organiser, who will take you to your accommodation. During your first few days you will be given an induction so that you can learn about Perth and its culture, as well as useful information like how to use the transport system etc.

**COUNTRY PROFILE:**

Australia's most striking feature is its variety of landscapes, with endless miles of unspoilt beaches (over 7,000 beaches - more than any other nation), tropical rainforests, mountain ranges and huge areas of desert - the famous 'outback'. The natural scenery is unbeatable.

Australians are known for their love of life and enjoyment of the great outdoors. While Australians have a relatively short history they have quickly developed their own unique culture - with their love of the humble meat pie, the arts and music, sport (Australian Rules Football is the national game), the beach and BBQs.

Visitors maybe confused when first arriving in Australia. While it's common knowledge that Australians speak English, you may hear a unique colloquial language. You'll hear words such as 'G'day', 'fair dinkum', and 'cobber'. Don't worry, you'll get the hang of it and will be talking like an Aussie in no time!

Perth's weather and climate is best described as Mediterranean, with long dry summers and mild rainy winters. It is because of these long hot

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summers that many Perth activities revolve around the water. So if you enjoy water sports such as swimming and surfing or lazing on clean sandy beaches, Perth is the perfect destination.

The hottest months are January and February, and temperatures can frequently reach the mid to high 30's Celsius (95-100F). Occasionally the weather can reach 38 degrees Celsius or more (100+ Fahrenheit), and when it does, it is colloquially referred to as "a scorcher".

The mild Perth winter begins at the start of June and finishes in September. It is generally a rainy season, interspersed with chilly yet sunny days. A typical Perth winter day may fall between 16-18 degrees Celsius (60-65 degrees Fahrenheit).

## THINGS TO DO IN: AUSTRALIA

- **Cities on the East Coast** include Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Cairns. Sydney has one of the most instantly recognisable Skylines in the world, where sunset views of the Opera House and Harbour Bridge are unforgettable. If you're feeling brave you can arrange to climb the Harbour Bridge - a 52 tonne structure! Sydney also has excellent nightlife, cuisine from around the world, many parks and museums, and not far from the city some incredible mountainous scenery. Many people don't realise that Sydney is not actually the capital of Australia - it's nearby Canberra, the country's political centre. Manly beach and the famous **Bondi Beach**, two popular surfing spots, are both located near Sydney.
- **Melbourne** is the state capital of Victoria and is the second largest city in Australia. Melbourne is very much about lifestyle with its vibrant energy, staggering choice of restaurants, funky boutiques, café-filled laneways, cool bars, unbeatable galleries, lush parks and village-like inner suburbs. New futuristic designs combined with the Melbourne of old create a fascinating mix of architecture and ensures the skyline is constantly changing. A standing joke in Australia is that Melbourne can experience four seasons in a day but this is really just another example of how they have it all!
- **Byron Bay** and **Noosa**, located further north and close to Brisbane, are very popular for surfing and are good for professionals and amateurs!
- **Fraser Island**, the largest sand island in the world. This protected region has over 100 freshwater lakes, ancient rainforests growing out of sand, and dunes stretching for miles.
- **The Great Barrier Reef**, located along the East Coast of Australia, is the largest coral reef in the world and wonderful place to learn to dive or simply snorkel. North of Cairns the region of **Cape Tribulation** has some spectacular beaches backed by rainforest.
- **Uluru** is a must see (also known as Ayres Rock). This sacred Aboriginal Meeting place, located in the middle of the outback, offers inspirational views, particularly at sunrise and sunset. Camping trips under the stars are popular. Nearby Kings Canyon, a less well known 'Grand Canyon' is another unforgettable site and something that everyone should see on a visit to Australia.
- **Endless Sandy Beaches**. On the West Coast of Australia, between Perth and Broome, there are miles and miles of perfect sandy beaches. Excellent wreck diving is abundant around Perth and this is also one of the best places to learn to dive in Australia. There are also plenty of snorkelling and other water sports on offer around Perth. As the majority of Australia's 20 million residents live close to the coast, beaches are an important part of life, and there are certainly plenty to choose from. Surfing, Snorkelling, Diving, Sailing and all other water sports are plentiful - so much so that Australian Dollar Notes are waterproof, just in case you should leave them in your shorts by accident!
